April Meeting



t the Group meeting we treated to a fascinating talk from one of our own members, Roger Bensaid Pi FEI. His talk was entitled 'From Rebel to Writer via pigs and palette'. After rebelling from his farther's RAF roots his ambition was to be an Army, white helmet display rider. Instead he joined up as a soldier in the Royal Corps of Signals as an electronics technician. Destined for greater things he was commissioned

into the Royal Army Ordinance Corps specialising in Oil and Petroleum Installation, but supplying any and all of the needs of the army. In this role he travelled the world, from the peace line in Cyprus to wonders that are Belize.

After leaving the Army he put skills in fuel supply to good use getting involved in UK pipeline fuel supply lines, storage tanks and road tanker distribution. All vital to the our everyday lives. His next adventure was in PIGs - Pipeline Inspection Gauges. The devices are used to clean debris from the insides of pipelines, and/or make non-destructive measurements of pipeline internals. This led inevitably to a career in Oil and Gas Industry operations management. Of course Roger was still a Reserve Officer in the Army where he was variously Commanding Officer for Ordnance Disposal, Ordnance Supply and Squadron Commander for support roles. Finally he became a Consultant specialising in Compliance and Trouble shooting both in the UK and overseas, which had him visiting both commercial and military installations.

In retirement Roger has been able to pursue his interests, which include a house in France where the adjacent farmers love to use their ancient harvesting equipment to bring in the crops and he is able to exercise his first love of painting and produce works of art, many of which have been exhibited at an Art Gallery near his home in France. And finally, Roger is a published author. Despite his difficulty in obtaining an English 'O' level he has already written a trilogy of novels, with the forth in the series on its way and some children's books which have been translated into four foreign languages (the fourth being English!!!).
