Harry Bates

Well, we all know this wonderful man, the one and only HARRY. His life began in 1925 in Battersea, London. He was born to mum and dad and a sister four years older, Mum unfortunately suffered a severe stroke, which meant his sister had to administer full time care.

Harry was called up for military duty during the war but was immediately deferred. The war brought great sadness to Harry, his mother was killed when a bomb struck their house, his sister spent 4 months in hospital and his brother in law 11 months. As for Harry he escaped any injury as he had left the house 30 minutes before the bomb landed.

Harry studied at Farnborough College and achieved a HN2. He then took up engineering and later went to work for British Rail where he stayed until his retirement in 1945. Harry's wife sadly passed away at the age of 58. Harry has lived alone ever since. He was diagnosed with prostate cancer 15 years ago.

Harry still finds time to go to the gym on Mondays with the group and Hook Community Centre every week. What a great guy, he has just celebrated his 92nd BIRTHDAY! Happy Birthday and thank you Harry, you are a true inspiration.
