Finally, University Hospital Southampton NHS Foundation Trust or specifically Southampton General Hospital, has revealed the roll out of a new state of the art radiotherapy machine which will be used to improve the efficiency and accuracy of this treatment whilst removing the current need for permanent tattoos. Surface Guided Radiation Therapy (SGRT) uses high-tech cameras and sensors to produce a unique map of the surface of a patient's body. Southampton General is one of the first hospitals to use the upgraded SGRT equipment.

Whilst Southampton General is not part of the Hampshire Hospitals Foundation Trust (HHFT) which is our catchment area, several of our members, myself included are referred to Southampton General for facilities that are not available in HHFT.

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Meeting Report

eith Jones opened the meeting and requested that the minutes for the 2023 AGM be approved and seconded. The meeting then proceeded with the elected officers' reports.

Chairman's Report

In his first review of the year, Keith mentioned that the balance of funds from the Lodden Lillies had been received bringing the total to £5,000. He also commented on the increase in member numbers and the presence at prostate cancer awareness events, namely:

- Basingstoke Festival of Transport
- Tadley Treacle Fair (first time)
- Basingstoke Malls

Other highlights were the start of the Special Interest Group sessions as part of the group meetings, the success of the Pint & Chat monthly meetings, the first social event and the renewed contact with the Clinical Nurse Specialists (CNS).

He then moved on to thank the committee members for the time they give to organising the group, the ladies who look after the meeting refreshments, the members who organise the raffle and finally the members themselves for donating prizes for the raffles and participating in the events through the year.

Treasurer's Report

David Janetta reported a healthy financial position following the receipt of the balance of the Lodden Lillies donation as well as some smaller donations. Aside from this, the major source of income is the sales of raffle tickets which has increased over the year and donations for the refreshments at the meetings. David thanked everyone who had donated prizes for the raffles. Major expenditures in the year were to Basingstoke Voluntary Action (BVA) who helped with the redesign of our publicity materials, the printing of new publicity materials and banners and the charge for the room hire at Brighton Hill (£60 per month). He also mentioned the charge for insurance which was a new item of expense in 2023, this having been previously been provided by Prostate Cancer UK before their reorganisation in respect of their relationship with support groups.

Secretary's Report

Allan Roper reported that we now have 132 members recorded for the group although not all attend the meetings, some preferring just to receive email updates. This is an increase of 24 new members and in part reflects the part being played by RHCH Winchester now signposting newly diagnosed men to our group. Average attendance at the monthly group meeting was 44 men and their partners.



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Allan then talked about the Pint and Chat nights which continue to be successful' not necessarily in the numbers attending but from the point of view that when a newly diagnosed man attends, the feedback we get is that discussing their diagnosis and listening to other men's experiences helps in their decision making.

He also mentioned the members who have agreed to share their experiences with the newly diagnosed men on a one-to-one basis and his hope is that we will continue to provide that service.

The meeting then moved on to the **Election of Officers**

The Chairman – Keith Jones, Treasurer – David Janetta and Secretary/Membership Secretary – Allan Roper all re-stood for their respective positions. As no other members had put themselves forward for election to these positions, the incumbents were duly re-elected.

Committee Members

- Current committee members who confirmed they would continue as serve as committee members were Roger Bensaid, Martin Budd, Keith Bunker and Mike Davies.
- Two members put themselves forward to join the committee, Jeff Twigg and Richard White.
- Two committee members stood down at the AGM, Brian Tidbury and Richard Holt. They were thanked for their contributions. Brian Blanchard had stood down earlier in the year.

After some questions from the floor, the AGM was declared closed. The minutes of the meeting together with the officers' reports will be circulated to all members in due course.

During the refreshment break, the Special Interest Group met, with this month's topic being Metastasis with some good discussion taking place.

After the serious business of the AGM had been completed, to lighten the mood Keith Jones hosted a fun quiz with a words round, a cockney rhyming slang round and a musicals round for which the prizes were chocolate bunnies to keep the Easter theme. The winning team, the Twiggs and the Janettas scored a very impressive score of 28 correct out of 30.
