We hope that you have had some real benefit from being a member of the NHPCSG but remember that many more men are now being diagnosed with prostate cancer and they need your help too. You don't have to join the committee, maybe just making the teas and coffees, or be willing to share your treatment experiences with a newly diagnosed man on the phone or over a coffee or a pint. We used to have occasional lunch meetings at a pub, it would be great to get those going again, or what about a walking group – something that other support groups tell us work really well.

Please take some time to think about how you could help keep our support group going and let Allan or myself know.

Following Covid we really have little idea of how many of our previously registered members want to stay on our mailing lists as we are only getting about half as many at our monthly meetings. You don't need to come to monthly meeting to remain a member, if the exercise group, this newsletter or a chat to someone over the phone works for you that's great, but we are asking everybody to re-register for membership as this helps us to plan better to support you.
