am pleased to report that the AGM was a success. We had enough members attending to make the session quorate and we were able to transact all of the AGM business. <u>AGM NHPCSG – Secretary Report.</u>

urrently we have 108 members not all of whom attend group meetings, some members are happy to just receive correspondence.

Our monthly group meeting attendance averages 40 people, members and partners.

Since the 2022 AGM we have gained 15 new members which is a good deal more than we were seeing pre covid. This has been helped by the part being played by a new member of staff at the hospital in a role of Prostate Cancer Pathway Navigator and the group literature being passed to newly diagnosed men.

The Pint and a Chat nights have proved successful not necessarily in the numbers attending but from the point of view that when a newly diagnosed man attends the feedback we get is that discussing their diagnosis and listening to other mens experiences helps in their decision making.

This has also been the experience with those men who have made contact for assistance without attending any group sessions. They have been signposted to group members for discussion about experiences and again the feedback has been that they have been grateful for the help provided which they advise has been invaluable in their decision making.

So thank you to all the members who have agreed to share their experiences with the newly diagnosed men.

On the morning of the AGM I received a mail from Loddon Lillies advising that they will be transferring £3042 into the group account which added to the monies they have already provided for the purchase of equipment gives a total of £5k raised for our group. There will be a formal cheque presentation on the 22nd April at the White Hart Sherfield on Loddon and I will give thanks on behalf of the group for their generosity. There was a straw pole of experiences of getting urgent support from the local NHS urology team. One or two distressing stories were shared at the meeting.

A general question to the audience was 'Who had heard of Non PSA secreting prostate cancer?' Only one other member of the audience was aware of this and that was because both Martin and the other member did regularly attend the Living Well with Advance Prostate Cancer zoom group. The real question is how to detect this form of cancer in its early stages. The Advanced Prostate Cancer zoom group is one of two diagnosis specific groups run by Tackle. If you have been diagnose with Advanced Prostate Cancer then details below indicate how to request joining this group. The other similar group is for men who have undergone Brachytherapy, details for joining this group are also shown below.
