Prostate Cancer Research - Proactive For Your Prostate Campaign



I know I have covered this in previous issues but I want to keep it to the forefront of everyone's thoughts and we are now approaching the time of action for this campaign which starts in October, so there will be even more press coverage.

As previously stated, the aim is to get a targeted screening and then a national screening programme approved by National Screening Committee (NSC) by the end of 2025. It is five years since prostate cancer screening was

put before the NSC and as you will all know, there have been great advances in the research of detection processes and this will be a key part of the submission to the NSC. The current action from PCR continues to be to encourage people to contact their MP to urge them to support the campaign. At the last count there were 137 MP's who have indicated their support. You can find out more information from the link below.

I can see my MP for Winchester, Danny Chambers is on the list but I still do not see Luke Murphy from Basingstoke, Kit Malthouse from North West Hampshire and Alex Brewer from North East Hampshire on the PCR website. Trials and Focus Groups

There are two focus groups that group members may be interested in signing up for. The first is from the Stampede Trial Development Group who are looking for men who have a radical prostatectomy in the last 5 years to participate in an online focus group. The details are below.

STAMPEDE Trial Development Group

Researchers are planning a new trial for men who have undergone, or are due to undergo, surgery for prostate cancer.

- •The trial will explore how using tumour "fingerprints" (biomarkers) could help identify who might benefit from earlier, more personalised treatment after surgery.
- •They want to hear from men who have had a radical prostatectomy in the last five years.
- •Focus groups will be held online (MS Teams) in September 2025.
- •Dates will be arranged via a Doodle poll to suit as many as possible.

The second focus group is being organised by the MRC Clinical Trials Unit based at University College London. This unit is looking to develop a trial for men at a higher risk of prostate cancer returning after surgery. More details are below.

Working Aged Men and Partners


